Construction of Sanitation Schemes with Street Pavements

Dilawar Street Lore Karez Quetta



Innovative Development Organization is implementing the Quetta Urban Development Program (QUDP) under RAHA with the support of UNHCR and in collaboration with Commissioner Afghan Refugee Office. The target areas of the project are Union Council Lore Karez and Union Council Kuchlak. The main focus of the project is to construct sanitation schemes and street pavements, provision of enterprise development opportunities in UC Lore Karez and Construction of collection points for solid waste in UC Kuchlak.

The construction of sanitation schemes with street pavements was undertaken in union council Lore Karez District Quetta. On the whole, given the allocated budget for the schemes, 19 streets were selected for construction of sanitation schemes with street pavements. The community was reached through 3 Citizen Community Boards which had previously worked with IDO in the implementation of another project in the area and 4 new committees were formed for the construction of 6 sanitation schemes with street pavements in Mughalbad.

This case study is based on the views of the community members in two streets where sanitation schemes with street pavements were successfully completed.

Madrassa Street – I

Muhammad Ramzan is a resident of the Madrassa Street in Lore Karez and an active member of the supervision committee for the construction works.

“Before the intervention”, Muhammad Ramzan told us, “there was too much garbage on the streets with paper and polythene bags frequently floating on the street. The rain water”, he further added, “always entered our houses and people were very vulnerable to diseases and the living conditions during rain became worse.”

The IDO team, in coordination with the Citizen Community Board (CCB), selected the Madrassa Street which also includes 2 sub-streets for construction of sanitation schemes with street pavements.

“Since the construction of the street pavement and sanitation scheme, our problem has been solved”, Ramzan told us, “UNHCR and its implementing partner IDO have helped us greatly and improved our living conditions. We are very thankful to UNHCR for providing us the scheme.”

Aurangzeb is a resident of the Lalai Street in Lore Karez and a member of the committee formed for the construction activities. IDO is very thankful to Aurangzeb for taking out time for the supervision of the construction activities in the street.

“There is a lot of garbage in our area”, Aurangzeb told us, “and there was rubbish in the open drains all the time which resulted in the blockage of the open drains which caused us many problems.”

Since the completion of the construction activities, marked difference has been noticed in the environment of the street, “Our street has become so clean and beautiful after the construction of sanitation scheme with street pavement! I think that this will keep our children healthy and reduce the spread of disease.”

On the whole, the residents of the Lalai Street are very satisfied with the construction work done and the community was actively involved in the construction work.

“We are very thankful to UNHCR who have provided us a better environment under the RAHA programme.”
